A packed hall greeted Wade Muggleton for his April talk on 'Maximising Backyard Fruit and Veg'. Wade's advice is not to worry about the size of your plot but accept it and plan wisely. He does not have a large garden but is able to provide enough fruit and veg to feed his family all year round. Why bother to plant up your garden? Freshness, healthy eating, food security (you know where it has come from), money saving, good for the environment and great fun.

Before you start, think what use your in home, prioritise high useage, then sort out your growing beds. He likes raised beds you can tend without having to step on the soil, just forks them over and never digs. Perennial crops cut labour, so a good few fruit trees and bushes are money saving. Select a good area to plant, so that you can harvest easily; can be grown containers; he has many that he moves into all kinds of spaces and grows successive crops of salad plants right through the season. He is a great believer in liquid feeds and makes several different kinds: comfrey, nettle

and worm which he gives to his crops weekly.

He advised to always sow and plant things close together to maximise production and keep down the space available to weeds. He also utilises all manner of items to cover and protect his crops from frost and birds. The talk came with pictures of his garden in various states of production and it was good to see the results of the family's hard work when they were harvesting. We all felt very enthused and left the meeting keen to improve our plots.

The blends are mixed through a series of hoppers with blowers at each level. There's dust in the air, but everywhere it's clean.

Amongst speakers in an array of rooms was Dinnie herself,

telling how she sat in a nominal office waiting for the phone to ring during those early days. She admitted she was on the verge of going back to her family and saying it hadn't worked, when a call from a major baking group opened the door to future success.

Philip Dunne recalled opening the warehouse building three years ago, when turnover was about £1 million. Today it's £6 million as Kudos continue the big push in America. Bob Jordan, Dinnie's father, was quietly smiling in the background, proud of a shrewd investment in family talent.

The happy atmosphere that prevails throughout the works is product of Dinnie's willingness to involve everyone in the celebration and recognise the contribution they have all made. From the person sweeping the floor to the MD herself, they work as a team and succeed; it's a model of modern management thinking getting the best from everyone. As one man said: "Best boss I've ever worked for."

#### **Cancer in Pets**

The word 'cancer' strikes fear into the heart of many pet owners, and unfortunately it's something we see all too commonly. However, if caught early there are often treatment options available to help slow (if not cure) progression of the disease and ensure that a good quality of life is maintained.

The correct term for cancer is 'neoplasia' which means 'an abnormal growth of new cells'. Tumours can be 'benign' which means that the tumour won't spread to other parts of the body, and does not usually destroy or alter surrounding tissue. An example of this that we see commonly is a 'lipoma', which is a benign tumour composed of fatty tissue.

Sometimes however, tumours are 'malignant' which means that they can spread (metastasize) to other sites in the body, or invade and destroy tissues. Malignant tumours tend to grow quickly. An example of a malignant tumour is an 'osteosarcoma', which is a tumour of bone.

Cancer is something that can affect any part of the body, and hence can cause many different symptoms. For example, cancer affecting the gastrointestinal system can cause loss of appetite, vomiting, diarrhea and weight loss.

There are a variety of tests used to help detect cancer including blood tests, x-rays and ultrasound scans. Samples can often be taken from a suspected tumour either with a needle or by biopsy to determine what type of cells are present, and to help decide what treatment may be the most appropriate.

Depending on the type and location of neoplasia, surgery may be a suitable treatment, for example to remove a tumour on the skin, and this is often curative. Chemotherapy is also available for animals, just as for people, and the cancer we use this for most commonly is lymphoma. We do not use as high doses as in people as the side effects are not tolerable for animals. Therefore the aim of chemotherapy usually to induce period a 'remission' (where we see no signs of the cancer) rather than to be curative, although remission can last for many months to years in some cases. Radiotherapy is also available for animals, just as for people, although this is at specialist centres only rather than your local veterinary practice. Pets do regularly get non-cancerous lumps





#### LIFE CAN BEGIN AGAIN AT 58



Dave Hinves - moving on as new horizons beckon.

Dave Hinves and his family moved to Cleobury Mortimer in 1980, when he was a newly qualified sports teacher at Lacon Childe. He was keen and energetic, making his mark before moving just up Love Lane to run the Sports Hall before taking over as Sports Development Officer for the old South Shropshire District Council.

When Shropshire became a Unitary Authority he was one three Area Managers covering the county. Then came austerity and restructuring, and December 2013 he was given months notice redundancy. 34 years service with the county meant he was fairly treated, with a payout and a pension plus a lot to be proud of: "When I came to Shropshire in 1980 leisure was a new idea. We developed quality facilities across the county."

"South Shropshire District Council was excellent and I

enjoyed working for them for over 20 years. There were some really good officers at the top," he says. But he wanted work, to make a little extra and give his wife Cath the chance to retire if she chose. "I did consider going back into education, but I wanted self employment and to have my own business." He looked at driving school opportunities and the AA and the British School of Motoring to be the best prospects - they are part of the same company.

He opted for BSM and paid for his own training in their methods; when he'd passed all three required tests he took out a weekly franchise. For that he gets a car - his first is a Vauxhall Corsa - business support including courses to further his knowledge, and advertising. The car is sign written with his name and the BSM contact number and it will be replaced roughly once a year. Now he needs to go out and look for business and as it builds, he can expect to be covering up to 1,000 miles this sparsely a week in populated area, where each pupil will normally be a long from the next. Those pupils will range from complete novices to more experienced beginners who just need their driving technique given a final polish. When we talked he'd seen his first pupil pass his test: "That means I've got a 100 percent success rate," he ioked.

The modern driving test is a much more demanding experience than veterans ever had to deal with. The theory side comprises two parts, the Hazard Perception videos and 100 multiple choice questions, divided into four sections, and pupils have to score at least 20 out of 25 in each section to move on to the practical stuff out on the highway. They also have to know how to check oil and water levels and be able to deal with minor roadside problems.

The driving side takes 40 to 45 minutes and includes both town and rural areas. If all that sounds a bit stiff compared with the standards of the 50s and 60s, it does mean that new drivers attain a decent standard before they're let loose. Let's face it, modern traffic demands a good level of concentration and awareness.

Dave is aiming to be available more than 60 hours a week, but can book off if he needs a rest. His aim is 20 pupils a week and there were quite a few bookings in his diary when we talked. So a man of mature years can find another career if he's really determined, but after all the sports work, does he enjoy this new direction? "Oh yes, it's great fun," he assured us.

We have been told that one driver got so lost that one bus ended up in Ironbridge!. This does sound a little excessive, even by Diamond standards but if you were on that bus, let me know.

Still no sign that the 2Ldeparts from the usual stop in Corve Street so not ideal if you are unfamiliar with the area. On the other hand, the bus stop at Ludlow Leisure Centre still shows the 2L stopping there but there was no-one queuing, so they must have got fed up or died waiting. No more news on any timetable changes although that doesn't mean there won't be any and still no call re the availability of timetable from the Kiddy depot. I'm really glad I haven't spent the last five weeks sitting by the phone just in case.

As I write this on April 24th drivers are still charging users of the 9.19 to Kiddy £1. This is despite Shropshire Council's repeated assurances that this had been sorted. Mind you, yesterday the 9.19 didn't arrive until after 9.30 so that was a quid saved. The Traffic Commissioners Birmingham are still looking into various complaints about Diamond and have asked for copies of future 'On the buses' articles for information so if you have any other bad experiences on the 2L, let me know and I will include them.

However, there has been a development; meeting between Shropshire and Worcestershire Councils discuss the situation and apparently Diamond will be reminded (again!) not to raise a charge. I haven't yet found out what else was discussed but at least they have now met each other. When I asked Shropshire for the name of their Worcestershire contact a while ago, they told me that they didn't have it. As a cynic, this makes me think that either they were being 'economical with the truth' and closing ranks or that they genuinely

didn't know the name of their opposite number in the next county in which case, words fail me...



## The Farming Page - Catherine and John Evans of **Broome Park Farm**

After a busy few months we have finally finished lambing and you may have noticed all the ewes and lambs in the fields around Cleobury. This vear overwhelmed by the number of multiple births - in an ideal world each ewe would have twins but this year we have had over 100 sets of triplets so have had to set up a milk bar feeding station for the extra lambs. I have bottle fed 4 lambs, both couples from sets of quads, with lots of help from our B&B guests! It always surprises me that even the most austere guest (of any age) goes weak at the knees at the mention of bottle feeding!

The farm have also invested in a new toy for John – a self propelled sprayer. This enables him to go out and spray the crops without waiting for the right tractor to become available. It also has a larger water tank allowing a bigger area to be sprayed before needing to be filled up, saving precious time. At this time of the year crops are sprayed with fungicides and pesticides to combat weeds and pests, hopefully ensuring a good yield come harvest time.

The majority of planting has now been finished, with only the maize left to plant and the next big jobs are shearing and hay/silage making. At the moment the farmer is hoping for rain to help the crops grow but a spell of dry weather will be needed to make good hay, ideally 3 or 4 consecutive days, as once the grass is cut it needs to dry out before baling, but if left too long due to a shower or two the goodness is lost. We bale most of our hay into large round bales which can be handled mechanically and fed directly to the cattle with only a small number of traditionally sized small bales, easier to man handle for horses and hobby farmers. Silage is also made from grass but this time it doesn't need to dry out so much and is wrapped in plastic to be kept for winter feeding, you can often see the big round bales of silage in the fields until the farmer has time to gather them up.

As you can tell, weather is always a big topic of conversation in our house, forecasts avidly watched and checked online morning, noon and night. Personally I think the best thing is to look out of the window, as despite all the sophisticated prediction tools available to modern forecasters, they never quite seem to get it right! Let's hope for a long hot summer without too much rain.

## Clarion Coppers with CPSO Nick Morris



The first crime report for our area since the last issue was a burglary in Catherton Road at 3:25am on March 16th when a garage was broken into and power tools stolen. The offenders were believed to have been in a white Citroen Berlingo in cloned plates - FL55 KCX. Another burglary at a garage occurred on March 19th/20th in High Street, Stottesdon. Again, power tools were stolen. A shed burglary took place soon after midday on March 22nd in Stanbrook Road, Burford. The shed had been left insecure and power tools stolen from inside. Overnight on March 22nd/23rd access was gained to a shed at the Activity Centre in Stottesdon where a mountain bike and power tools were stolen. A single axle trailer worth £500 was stolen from the old Horse and Jockey site at Far Forest after Harris fencing had been cut at approximately 10:45pm on March 26th. Between 6:15am and 6:30am on April 5th, a Mitsubishi L200 parked on the lay-by at Hollywaste had six LED lights stolen. Two males were observed at the scene in a white Ford Transit - SN64 MDK which was located, but the owner denied committing the offence. Enquiries are ongoing. An attempted burglary occurred at 2:40am on April 18th at a house in Furlongs Road. The victim had heard a noise whilst she was in bed and went downstairs to investigate. She was shocked to discover an unknown male standing inside the house who ran off after she screamed at him demanding to know what he was doing there. This male was described as being 6ft tall and of a skinny build. He was wearing blue jeans, white trainers and a black hoodie with the hood up. It is possible that his intention was to locate the car keys in order to steal the victim's car. Between 5:30pm and 7:00pm on April 19th a resident of Vaughan Road saw a hand appear above her garden fence and rip part of the Sky 'dish' off, causing £15 worth of damage. The offender had gone by the time the victim had gone out to investigate. Between 3:00pm on April 17th and 7:15am on April 20th, a building site cabin was broken into at Kinlet. A laptop computer and a camera were stolen together with sets of keys to machinery and site buildings. On the evening of April 8th, a well known male resident of Cleobury was arrested at Tuffins for a breach of an antisocial behaviour order, criminal damage and assault. He was remanded in custody whilst waiting to be dealt with by the Court.

It's the time of year when we see an increase in garden crime. Shed breaks are common and because sheds are not generally designed for safe storage, it is advised that valuable equipment is not stored in them. If there is no alternative storage place, then fit a closed shackle padlock to the door. Fittings should be bolted through the door, and screws concealed. Fit grilles or mesh to any windows and fit an alarm. Secure valuable items inside the shed by chaining them together or lock them to a secure fixture. Any items stored in a garage would be safer if they were secured in the same way, so that if a thief breaks in they would be difficult to take away. It seems obvious, but never leave an insecure shed or garage. It only takes an opportunist thief seconds to enter and take your chainsaw or strimmer that you were intending to use later in the day! Always lock the outside doors of your house. Thieves are known to enter houses, take car keys hanging on a hook near the door and pinch the car. Easy peasy! Always try to be security minded. If you do all you can to inhibit thieves you will be more able to relax.



## Linda Iles May In The Wyre Forest

The arrival of warm weather last month turned my attention to some of the wildlife of the forest that appear to enjoy basking in the sunshine as much as I do. They are the reptiles and, being cold blooded, rely on temperature around them to raise their bodies to a fullyfunctioning state. One of the where the sites Wyre Community Land Trust volunteers have been working in recent months is a haven for lizards. I suspect that the clearing of bramble, planting of orchard trees and reintroduction of grazing may make it less attractive to the lizards but they will still have sunbathing spots and places to hide. Most people taking a walk in the forest on a sunny day in spring, summer or autumn will catch sight of a lizard taking advantage of a nice warm rock.

The same is not true of slow worms, which are in fact legless lizards. These beautiful, bronzecoloured creatures are fairly common around the farm but like cooler, damper places. I often find them hiding under some sheets of corrugated iron in the yard. I wish them well and a hearty appetite for the slugs they feed on.



The adder, which less than a century ago was still plentiful and locally common in the Wyre Forest, is now restricted to just a few small isolated "island" populations and probably numbers less than 100 individuals total. Their in continuing decline may be due many factors, including habitat degradation, accidental and deliberate disturbance by people, and an increase in their natural predators such buzzards, pheasants and crows.

The best time to look for them is as they bask in the morning before the sun gets too hot, but they are notoriously difficult to see and will disappear back under cover as soon as they sense the vibrations heralding the approach of humans. They eat lizards and small mammals such as voles and mice, and favour sunny banks, especially heathland. The first individuals appear from



hibernation in March and they will slough off their old skins during the spring. courtship and mating in April and May the adults go their separate ways and the females give birth in September. Five to twenty eggs can be produced but since the shells rupture on laying the female appears to give birth to live young. Dropping temperatures October trigger a return to hibernation underground among rocks or under tree stumps.

'Fauna Britannica', Stefan Buczacki's wonderful collection of scientific information, literary references and folklore about our native wildlife, has some fascinating stories about adders. One remedy for snake bites (now pretty rare and almost never fatal) was to apply water strained through a 'bag of heads', containing heads of an adder, toad and newt. There are also references to the supposed protective properties of the ash tree. I could go on, but instead encourage you to look them up for yourself.



## IN BUSINESS: Hands On Printing



John Hands has been trading on the High Street for two years come July. Yet people walk past his modest shopfront next door to Bowketts Food Emporium ("Their sandwiches are excellent," he says) and don't realise what goes on there. Having sat and talked to the man, we can tell you that No 43 is like a Service Tardis, with a great deal inside.

He's a multi-talented man in the matter of photos and printing, first taking pictures as an 11 year old schoolboy, developing and printing at home. His experience covers everything from glass plate cameras through to current generation digital devices. His

first job was in publicity at the Avery scales factory, then on into the printing industry and some unusual techniques to get the biggest prints developed, like lying them on the floor and washing off with mops. If you have a 20 feet wide print and a six feet long sink, that is.

He did a lot of wedding photos and smiles at the memory: "You have to control maybe 80 people you've never met before. I remember one school teacher admiring how I did it and telling me she'd had three years at college to learn that." Today his photo work is mainly passport pictures, which at £4.00 for six are great value; he knows a place not many miles away where they charge £10!

Printing keeps him busy, small batches for local traders his speciality, if you can call 10,000 leaflets a small batch. He can handle posters and banners, up to 24 inches (60cm) wide by any length. The same principle of charging a realistic price, not trying to make a killing, brings work from people who get a pleasant surprise when he quotes a price. "I learned from Indian traders I knew in the

West Midlands," he explains. "If they could buy at a good price, they'd sell at a good price too."

Below the small shop is a basement, bigger equipment to convert all sorts of pictures and recordings to modern formats. Transparent slides to DVDs; video tapes, too. Old cine films to DVDs, and if the sound is bad he'll record music over the top to keep the crackles at bay. If you want a favourite print framed, he has a range of popular size frames in stock. And he does photo copying, black and white or colour, up to A3 size.

What all this amounts to is a shop where you walk in thinking it can't be done in this small rural town and the man says 'Yes' and charges a modest price. "I'm happy making a little bit, I'm not greedy," he says.

Which explains why Hands On is the shop we recommend to anyone who wants a copy of a photo published in the Clarion, happy to point people who don't have a computer and printer to a man who does.

And if that helps spread the word about his helpful attitude, he deserves it.


